

Little House

Maintaining a street-appropriate post-war façade, the renovation to this comfortable home has optimized the interior for the owners. Providing a range of new and flowing spaces, the updated space is modern, attractive and well connected. The strong personality of the existing shell is reflected in the boldly defined modern interior.





The silhouette of the home was retained, but a new colour palette has refreshed the exterior. A rich tea green colour complements oiled timber and provides contrast to the crisp white window frames. All of the internal spaces of this home required updating, and the structure, flow and spatial presence of the home has been entirely improved by the remodel.

A strong connection to the garden and Queensland backyard living has been achieved by opening up the interior space. The open plan kitchen, dining and living space flows naturally onto the back deck, introducing natural light inside and extending the room, blurring the distinction between indoor and outdoor spaces.

Reconstituted stone bench tops in the kitchen area are glamorous, durable and practical, providing a strong, hard contrast to the crisp

white laminate cupboard. The stone benchtops extend to the back deck as an extension of the kitchen to the barbecue area, creating yet another point of connection between the indoor and outdoor spaces.

High floating ceilings with large overhangs draw the deck into the envelope of the home. A timber screen shields the space from the adjoining residence, providing privacy to the clients, adding visual warmth to the deck and suggesting the feeling of an additional semi-internal room.

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
