Building designer Debra Wroe from Local Concepts (local-concepts.com.au) took the plan of the '60s home in Stafford, which had only one large bedroom and two smaller ones, and came up with a layout that has three large bedrooms, bathroom ensuits and an office off bathroom, ensuite and an office off the lounge, plus open-plan lounge, dining and kitchen areas leading on to the new deck

It is the deck that really provides the wow factor. It has a built-in natural gas barbecue and cooktop with an electric underbench oven. The wide timber rail serves two


